A brief one Page document that describes your background, what subject you wish to study and why, and also your reasons for choosing a particular institution in New Zealand for your study.</p> <p>4. All students also have to submit a latest CV.</p> <p>5. Educational certificates. Evidence of Employment – Originals and attested copies If the student is working, and taking leave to study, provide an original letter of leave from the employer on company letterhead. If student is resigning from the job, a work reference from the employer on company letterhead is a must. The company's address and phone number must be included on the letter.</p> <p>7. Two reference letters from professors/HOD/tutors of previous College/university.</p> <p>8. Portfolio - A portfolio of relevant visual work. This can be digital or hardcopy format. Applicants • are required to state and sign a disclaimer guaranteeing all work provided as portfolio material is their own. Please see individual course outlines for portfolio requirements.</p>
